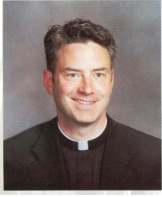
**Saturday, October 15 at 12:00N** at the Locomotive on Lauridsen Blvd (*across from the Library*)

**A New Translation of the Roman Missal**

Greetings in Christ Jesus.

Significant changes are coming to Masses in the English language starting the first Sunday of Advent, November 26/27, 2011 – *Yeah!* These changes only affect the words spoken and sung at Mass not the rubrics (what we do). Furthermore, these changes only affect the Catholic English speaking world (12 percent?); as most other languages used the principles that we are only just now implementing, 40 years ago.

The Mass of the Roman Rite (our Mass) used to only be said in Latin. That changed in the 1960's when Mass began to be said in the various vernacular (spoken) languages of the world. At that time the Mass itself underwent radical changes: i.e. priest facing people, receiving Communion standing, folk music, changed prayers, etc. – so a lot of change in a short period of time. One of those changes, going from Latin into the vernacular, is an inexact science. Because of the nature of languages, no one language can be perfectly translated into another. The principles that guided the Church's translation of the Latin text of the Mass into English in the 1960's and 70's have changed. The translation that we now have at Masses in English throughout the world is not as exact as it should be and that is the reason for the new translations that are coming out. From your own reading of the Mass responses that are coming, you will notice that the translation that we use now not only uses words that don't line up with some of the words in Latin, but in many cases, omits words and inserts others that are not in the Latin text in the first place.

In time, some other languages (Pacific Island native languages) will be making changes too because they translated their Mass text from our English translation not from the Latin. All the more reason why English, as the predominant global language, needs to be accurate.

These changes have been in the works for almost 10 years now, as I saw my first copy of the proposed changes eight years ago! They have undergone extensive evaluation by experts and bishops alike and will bring about greater theological accuracy and poetic richness. Change can be difficult for many though, and I acknowledge that, especially change to something as intimate and familiar as the Mass. This is a good change though. Please be patient and hopeful.

In the coming weeks, we will have handouts at the exits of our two churches that explain this whole thing in much greater detail. I will also be conducting a quick class between the two morning Masses at both parishes on back to back weekends. When the 5:00PM Mass arrives on November 26, there will be hundreds of laminated handouts in the pew racks for everyone to follow along with. Finally, by this time next year, we will have grown as comfortable with the coming Roman Missal of the Mass (text) as we are with the one we are using now.

In this bulletin, you will find those parts of the Mass that the congregation currently says or sings, side by side with the changed text that is coming. Enjoy.
