## Pastor's Column

Jesus is Lord!

Deacon Richard Labrecque has been involved in healing ministry for years and has, in conjunction with the Archdiocese of Seattle, put together a program for Queen of Angels Parish.

With the support of Archbishop Brunett, the local Western Washington Catholic Charismatic Renewal (WWCCR) Office has undertaken a three level 39 day healing prayer training program that has been successfully adopted by many parishes and dioceses in the United States. 45 members from Seattle Catholic communities and 14 from the Olympic Peninsula Parishes have completed this training (many with already 15-25 years of prior experience praying for healing). These individuals are now working to offer healing prayer throughout the Archdiocese in concert with their local pastors. We are fortunate to now have healing prayer teams at Queen of Angels and St. Joseph parishes.

What is healing prayer, and how does it work? First - healing prayer does not substitute for proper medical and therapy services. While prayer can help, it is surely not a substitute for normal and proper medical assessment and attention. It is not therapy or professional counseling. It is neither the Sacrament of Confession nor a substitute for it; nor is it the Sacrament of Anointing, though it may be experienced during services involving this sacrament. The healing prayer team ***Listens, Loves and Prays*** for one to receive the healing power of God's Spirit. God is the healer, and He alone can perform such miracles of healing. Yet, as the body of Christ, we can and will intercede for the Spirit to do God's good work, knowing that God wishes only the best for all of us, sinners and saints alike. How and when He will heal is totally up to His sovereignty – but we have seen both during Christ's ministry on earth and through the ministry of His Church over these past two millennium. Sometimes God heals in miraculous ways beyond our wildest dreams.

What kinds of things can and will the teams pray for? Prayer can aid almost every aspect of our lives – spiritual, physical, mental, and emotional. Yet often it is the peace that comes from loving and compassionate prayer that can aid healing and align one with God's will. Experience with healing has shown that even physical issues can often have inner or spiritual roots that would benefit from God's healing touch. Inner and spiritual healing needs include: habitual sin, pornography, unforgiveness, addictions, trauma of many kinds, feeling rejection by those whose love is critical to our well-being, divorce, death of loved ones, family of origin/intergenerational issues, abortion, and any other life issues that have left us wounded and without proper healing. Prayer can also bring spiritual healing and growth through tying one to the unconditional love of the Father, the life giving blood and water from His Son, and the wisdom and power of His Spirit.

How can these prayer teams be contacted? For one-on-one prayer time sessions, contact the parish office who will put you in contact with the coordinator who can set up a time and place for you to meet with a team. A simple but confidential form collects information to help the team prepare for your time together. A team may be two or three prayer team members who have completed the above training and have been approved by your pastor for this ministry. Please welcome and use these faithful members of God's healing power.
